Everything we did, we did for others' benefit. That they derived no benefit from it dismayed us not a whit.

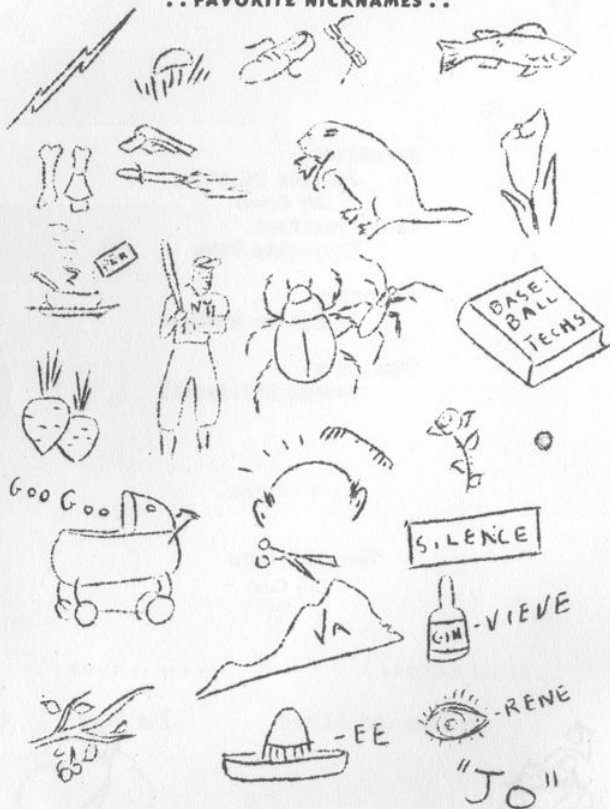
