The "quod's and quid's", tenses, baffling rules, and frequent exceptions no longer frighten the Freshmen in their study of Latin.



The untiring efforts of the boys to give respect and homage to the Holy Name of Christ can truly be recognized in their wholehearted participation in all activities of the Holy Name Society.


