



Dedication






Our model for scholasticism is Donald Thomson pictured above. He represents the many hours we have put into study -- whether it was a short exercise in English or a long term paper in History.




In order to become a full fledged citizen it is necessary to understand the functions of our government. The Seniors, our future leaders, are being enlightened through their American History class.



The English class spend much of their time in the library referring to the wide variety of encyclopedias for information. They also find it a place of peace and quiet where they can work their assignments from other classes.



Under the supervision of Sister Gertrude, Sophomores study how to cope with their future financial problems.




To write as fast as you talk would be considered quite a feat, but to the Shorthand class it is just a matter of knowing the right characters and "practice makes perfect."



The Music Appreciation class through their extensive study of various types of music and composers will be able to enjoy fine music when they hear it.




A new art is introduced in St. Casimir High! Acquiring a knowledge of sewing should make the Freshman girls very skillful housewives.

At a meeting of the members, the Casmirette staff converts to the Casmirecho staff.




The Sodality express their devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary by offering flowers.




The Holy Name Society was organized to give respect and homage to the Holy Name of Jesus. The officers of the society are being sworn in by the moderator, Father Nieckarz.



Since our school library is gifted with an abundance of good reference books, the students spend much of their time in the library studying their lessons.







Here, the Crescents meet All Saints in the season opener at St. Casimirs. Incidentally, the Crescents defeated the dauntless Saint's five, 27-23.





A few of the veterans on the school baseball teams are shown relaxing before a long awaited contest with one of the Division powers, St. Agnes.





