



Gardening, flowers and plants, have always been my passion. Since we've moved back to the US, from Canada, 10 years ago, we have worked on our yard, lovingly. The rocks were brought from Canada, from my previous garden, one by one being pulled in to the border for having dirt on them. Wanting to start with a clean slate, we dug everything out of the backyard. We have year after year added fencing, flower boxes, and anything I could plant flowers in. Trying to add more and more perennials, as we went on, filling in with annuals. My husband and son, with the help from a friend and neighbor built the Pergola last summer. For the past nine years, we have tried to grow grass in the front yard. It was an endless disappointment, with all the trees, roots and shade was never successful. Last year we added walkways and dug out almost the entire front yard where grass would not grow and filled in with Perennials and annuals. I have added a fountain, birdbath, birdhouses and a patio since our last garden walk. My biggest raves come from those who view my mop-head hydrangeas. Lilies and hostas are also my easy care flowers. I have some mobility challenges so I have maintained my gardens with the help of family and friends and also with the help of my power scooter. I'd love to share my gardens with you.

SPECIAL TREATS!! TREE GARDEN AT KLEINERT PARK

At Kleinert Park (Orangelawn and Hubbard), members of the Livonia Tree City Committee will be on hand to show the trees ORGHA was instrumental in planting. You can learn about city policy and funding for trees, water retention/detention at the new houses being built next to the park, and how critical planting native species is to the health of insects, birds and the environment.

30616 Cooley Blvd, Westland (1 block south of Franklin High School) Garden of your almost neighbor and ORGHA SUPPORTER, Margot McCormack, adv. Master Gardener

Welcome back to Margot's Horticultural Zoo, or, if it is your 1st time, I am glad you have come. As you can see I will not win a designer's choice award because I am a garden junkie and love to plant as many different kinds as they become available or I am attracted to. Therefore, my garden is never finished.

Did you know that I have been selling divisions of my plants at your annual garage sale for over 20 years? Since ours is a much smaller lot than you are accustomed to, I have almost no lawn in the front or the backvard.

You will see two espalier trees, a Bartlett pear against the house, and an apple tree dividing our neighbor's and our property to the East. The small tree near the sidewalk is a dwarf cherry tree. The tree near the curb was raised from a horse chestnut I brought back from Europe. There is no constant color in my garden year-round, but I can say something is blooming 10 months out of the year. I love perennials, herbs and spring bulbs.

My neighbor offered me to use her strip of land next to our driveway, which has become my vegetable garden. The climbing mini-rose by her chimney and the clematis survived the complete cut down a couple years ago when some masonry repair was necessary and new windows and a new furnace was installed. The tree next to the patio is a peach tree, which has fruited profusely in the past, or not, depending on a late frost. Here is also my herb garden. A small patch of raspberries next to my miniature conifer collection has been a great asset fruiting now and later in October. You will notice more espalier trees against the fence. Along the side you will see a red currant bush and rhubarb among the perennials.

I have also become interested in native plants and wildflowers. You can see them toward the back fence, this is also an area where we have poor drainage and get flooded every spring and after a downpour. Notice the two self-made rain barrels, and there are compost bins to make use of free resources,

Enjoy all the flowers that are white along the garage, an idea copied from the famous white garden in Sissinghurst, England.

If you're not familiar with the evening primrose, (the leaves look almost like dandelions), please come back and watch the blossoms opening around 9 pm. The flowers last only one night but new ones will open for many weeks. There is a newcomer in the front garden, another evening primrose that grows tall and very showy, but the blossoms take a bit longer to open, this is a bi-annual.
