## NEW CIVIC AFFAIRS COMMITTEE CREATED!!!

The Civic Affairs Committee is a new committee that has been formed this year to act as the liaison between the Civic Association and the Community. This committee will handle the following areas:

- Civic Association Meetings
- Delegate to the Federation of Civic Associations
- Delegate to the School Board Advisory Committee
- Subcommittees on Special Problems

The monthly meetings will be reports on community affairs that are of special interest to the residents in our area. The delegates to the two community activities will provide a voice for our Association on a wider basis. The "Special Problems" is the area that requires concentration at this time. Some problems have been with us for several years and still need emphasis, i.e. traffic problems, flooded basements, unpaved side streets, street lights, etc. but perhaps more important are the problems that may be here in the future. Civic Associations are known for their reaction to a problem but not many have anticipated the problem and worked to alleviate it before it ever became one. An example of this is the proposed "swimming pool-ice rink-recreation center being planned for Rosedale Gardens Park (Whitman Park). A committee of area residents should be working with the City and the architects now to voice any objection rather than waiting until the structure is built.

Your cooperation in bringing your civic problems to the Civic Association and then working to solve these problems will serve to strengthen the Civic Association and to improve our Community.
